

We encourage at least one of them to keep an eye on traffic!










The Cadets finished Labor Day by taking the flags down that had been put out downtown for VJ Day when the document ending WWII was signed on the U.S.S. Missouri.




On September 8<sup>th</sup> a contingent of Cadets went to Sherwood Island to assist with the 23<sup>rd</sup> Annual CT United Ride.




After the 9/11 Ceremony the Cadets completed their service to the community by taking the flags down again.






On September 20<sup>th</sup> the Cadets were asked to help with parking at the 50th anniversary celebration at Mill Ridge Primary School.

On September 21, 2024, the Cadets helped with the Meet the Superintendent event at Broadview Middle School.






Another Squad was at the War Memorial to help with Mission Health Danbury.

This past month has been exceptionally busy. On Thursday, September 26<sup>th</sup>, the Cadets will host another open house followed by our ten-week Basic Entry Skills Training (B.E.S.T) program. In January we are switching to a once-a-year Open House followed by the B.E.S.T. which will allow that training to occur during our slowest time of year and have the new Cadets prepared to help as the spring events start up. We will then be on a once-a-year schedule for the Open House going forward. This will allow us to then focus on more advanced training for the established Cadets. We have brought on a number of Advisors that are skilled trainers and are ready to move us to the next level.

We have had to decline several requests for the Cadets over the past couple of weeks. Many out-of-town groups are looking for assistance and we just can't meet the demand and maintain our high level of service. We have referred several to surrounding Cadet programs, but we appear to be sought after due to our ability to get the job done. The Cadets have an excellent reputation in Danbury and the surrounding area, and it has increased the demands on our program.

Our program is still in the midst of transitioning our uniforms and equipment from the old Explorer program to Cadets. Most of our Class A and all Class B uniforms have been transitioned. Two years ago, we were granted our 501c3 status through the IRS. We are working on a fundraising campaign to replace a lot of old uniforms and equipment. As you can see from the photos we tried to reuse our traffic vests by covering up Explorers and adding Cadets, but the process didn't work well and many of the letters have come off. We are working on that as well as other uniform and equipment issues. We have also begun a major website upgrade.

Our program is a mini department run on a shoestring, yet the Cadets continue to excel and exceed our expectations. We want to thank the Danbury Police Department's Administration, the City Council, and Mayor Alves for their continued support. We also need to thank our Advisors, both civilian and sworn, who put in many hours of service to this program and the community. Without them the Cadets would not be able to do all that they do as well as they do it.
